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

A Level Geography Trip to **Blencathra**

Geography A level students enjoyed a 2 day field trip to Blencathra last month. Day 1 centred around the water and carbon cycle, with students working on how to measure rates of infiltration, interception, and

surface run-off for the water cycle. Day 2 was a pilot study on the Solway Firth, where students had to create their own investigation title, data collection methods and consider ethics/risks of fieldwork, followed by work on measuring the carbon capture of trees and soil. BLACK HISTORY MONTH

In October, we celebrated Black History Month. So, what is Black History Month? Black History Month celebrates the contribution of black people in history and in the UK was organised by Akyaaba Addai-Seibo, a Ghanaian analyst who worked as a coordinator of special projects for the Greater London Council and collaborated with them to get it underway. It was first celebrated in London on October 1st, 1987, when Dr Maulana Karenga from the US was invited to an event at County Hall to mark the contributions of black people throughout history. Akyaaba Addai-Seibo made a plan to recognise those who had made contributions to cultural, economic, and political life in the UK. At present, the National Curriculum is supporting the teaching of black history in UK schools. Some famous black people who have made great contributions to history include Mary Seacole, Martin Luther King Jr. Rosa Parks, Nelson Mandela, and Marsha P Johnson. Some modern-day figures include Marcus Rashford MBE, Sir Lenny Henry, and Dr Maggie Aderin-Pocock MBE. At Beckfoot, we celebrated Black History Month with informative stands near the LRC and a dedicated assembly.

Teacher Feature

What inspired you to get into drama and teaching?

Right – two separate questions there! So I'll quickly tell you about my experience getting into performing arts. Ever since I was very, very young, I loved watching people dancing around and singing. I remember Britney Spears being on the TV and I thought: that's what I want to do. It was all because of Britney! As I grew older I did ballroom lessons, I did a lot of dancing and then my mum said to me "Sophie you can sing!" and I said "Oh, can I?!" So then I went and trained in musical theatre and went to drama school in London and I performed in the performing arts industry and that was my career for four years. I was on the TV, I did lots of stage work, lots of voice recordings and then I decided I didn't want to live in London anymore... I'm a Yorkshire girl at heart! So I moved back home and I decided I wanted to teach younger people and talk about my experiences and hopefully inspire them which is how I became a teacher.

When you were younger, what job did you want to have when you grew up?

I wanted to be Britney Spears! Shall I tell you something really funny? I was in primary school and they did a talent competition and I said "I want to be Britney Spears". My Mum and Dad got me a costume and I learnt the whole routine to 'Oops...I did it again', all of it, and I performed it in front of the whole school and I loved it, every bit of it! So I said: "When I grow up I want to be Britney Spears!" and that's exactly what I tried to become.

What would you do if you were invisible for a day?

I really, really, really, really love doughnuts. It's a big thing – everybody knows I love doughnuts. So if I was invisible for a day, I'd go to a doughnut factory and eat ALL of the doughnuts and dunk them in all the different flavours and just spend the whole day in the doughnut factory. That's what I'd do. Sounds weird, right?

What is your greatest achievement?

My greatest achievement is being able to move away from home and do my own thing. Being able to do what I've always wanted to do which is perform. It's a big deal isn't it? You live your whole life with your parents or your family or your carers and then you move away and do something you want to do. The day I stepped foot into drama school was my biggest achievement because I started to live my dream.

What is your funniest memory from secondary school?

How long have we got? I was in my Food Technology lesson, so what you call DT, and we were making a dish – I can't even remember what the dish was! We had to put something in the microwave and I put it on the wrong setting – it was something that had a milky texture I think. I pressed 'OK' and ding! off we went. And then all of a sudden, this smoke started appearing and I'm looking around thinking 'tut, who's done that?'Then I realized, it was my microwave. Everybody is shouting 'Quick get out of the classroom!' and all I can think about is what about my milk?! Everybody was laughing at me and then the fire alarm starts going off and obviously my recipe was a disaster and I did not finish my dish. I did nearly cry but looking back it's actually really funny. But yes, the fire alarm went off because of me. Oh, the shame.

What is your favourite type of soup?

So, I'm not a soup person. However, I do like homemade soup and a relative makes curried pea soup and it's wonderful. Sounds weird right? But it's really nice and tasty. But yes that's some of the only soup I eat. Pea and ham soup is nice as well. Tasty. Healthy. Full of protein.


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
