#### Intent

What are we trying to achieve?

A curriculum that ensures no student is left behind and inspires all learners to be confident communicators, knowledgeable and expert learners, committed community contributors and future-ready young people

#### Confident Communicators

Our curriculum provides opportunities for all our learners to be able to confidently express themselves and articulate their opinions in a range of scenarios both verbally and in writing. 'Find your voice. Talk, Listen, Learn.'

### **Knowledgeable and Expert Learners**

Our curriculum enables all our learners make above average progress no matter what their start point. Through well planned and sequenced schemes of work learners develop a wide range of skills and a breadth of knowledge. 'Enjoy, Learn, Succeed.'

### **Committed Community Contributors**

Our curriculum provides opportunities both in and out of the classroom for our learners to gain cultural capital and a deeper understanding of the world around them. All students develop their leadership skills and have a say in what goes on in their school.

## Implementation

How will we achieve our intent?

KS3 - Three Years KS4 - Two Years

In year 9 students choose three option subjects from 19. Throughout a two year key stage four they study these for three hours each a week alongside Maths, English and Science. Students guided to ensure a continuing breadth of study.

For the 50% of students who choose to remain with us at post 16 there are 20 subjects available to choose from. All learners take three subjects and study each for five hours a week.

Our personalised wave four provision ensures all learners are well supported so none are left behind no matter what their learning, social, emotional or mental health needs. Students are identified for this pathway by our SENCO.

Wave 4

Alongside the wave four provision, our DSP provision ensures that our learners with a physical need are not left behind. This support is both in and out of the classroom.

Our curriculum experience does not stop at the classroom door. All our students are encouraged to take part in our wide ranging sports and performing arts programme. Every KS3 student also spends a week each year on an enrichment activity of their choice.

## Impact

How will we know if we are successful?
