

Phase 1

All students will be expected to review their learning prior to a half termly assessment using 365, named websites and/or teacher support material.

- Every half-term a booklet of tasks will be set in a Humanities subject (History, Geography or RE).
- Students will have a choice of task each week.
- Each week students will show their completed task to a parent/carer or teacher to be signed off.
- The projects will be collected at the end of each half-term and assessed by teacher.
- Students are expected to spend between 30 minutes and 1 hour on these tasks.
- At the end of each half-term students will be awarded a certificate recognising their achievement. Students will stick this into their books as evidence.
- Students are expected to consolidate their learning from lessons each week.
- **Students are also required to catch up on work missed due to absence.**

Phase 2

All students will be expected to review their learning prior to a half termly assessment using 365, named websites and/or teacher support material.

Homework tasks will include:

- A weekly review of class work and checking for gaps in work and knowledge to consolidate learning.
- Independent revision of key themes and preparation for knowledge assessments
- Completion of or preparation for timed exam questions
- Research and wider reading, comprehension activities and project work.

We recommend that students purchase revision books from SFO and workbooks to consolidate their understanding of Phase 2 learning.

Students are also required to catch up on work missed due to absence.

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Students are expected to undertake 5 hours of independent study each week. The teacher will provide guidance and direction on what to study.

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- Every week students should review their class work and check for gaps in their work and knowledge.
- Students will read widely around their topic and undertake extra reading and revision as necessary in preparation for class discussions, knowledge tests and extended written tasks which will be set alternately week by week.
- In the instances where subjects require coursework students will, under the guidance of a supervisor, undertake independent research and meet set deadlines.

Students are also required to catch up on work missed due to absence.
