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1	Contextual Analysis P.A.M.C (Analysing the work of artists)	Contextual research consisting of a concise paragraph of biographical information which includes quotes and a detailed personal opinion commenting on: Personal Response, Aesthetics, Meaning and Context.
2	Critical Reflection W.H.W (Analysing your work as it develops)	What you have produced, how and why? The process of reflecting critically on your work as it develops. This may relate to your ideas, techniques/processes, experimentation/refinement or final piece.
3	Self Evaluation AOI, AO2, AO3, AO4 (Evaluating your project)	Carried out following the completion of a project. A01: Develop, A02: Explore, A03: Record, A04: Present.

Consistency of Presentation

I	Titles/ Headers	Drawn using stylistic qualities influenced by contextual sources.
2	Good Composition (Layout)	Each page is carefully well-balanced and aesthetically pleasing.
3	Supporting Images	Primary or secondary which are high resolution with an original aspect ratio (not stretched or squashed).
4	Supporting Work	All work that is too large to be included in sketchbooks must be labelled and made reference to within sketchbook.

Techniques & Processes

Ī	Formal Elements	Texture, Tone, Shape, Space (negative/positive), Line, Form, Colour, Pattern and Composition.
2	Application	How media is used to create works of art including blending, impasto and layering .
3	Sketch	A faint, rough or unfinished drawing or painting, often made to assist in making a more finished picture.

Course Content

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-	Observation	Using a combination of primary and secondary source material in a variety of different media.
2	Artist Study	Full scale artwork which is "In the style of" an artist's original piece or a "Pastiche" (imitation) of one. Develops approaches and techniques.
3	Development	Developing ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.
4	Experimentation /refinement	Refinement of work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.
5	Final Piece	Personal and meaningful outcome which realises intentions.
6	Related Study	An extended response of a guided minimum of 1000 words.

Key Vocabulary

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I	Painting	Practice of applying paint, pigment, colour or other medium to a solid surface. Painting media includes: oil, gouache, watercolour and acrylic.
2	Mixed Media	An artwork in which more than one medium or material has been employed.
3	Life Drawing	Also known as figure drawing, is the act of drawing a living person.
4	Fore- shortening	The treatment of an object or human body in a picture so as to produce an illusion of projection or extension in space.
5	Sculpture	An artistic form in which hard or plastic materials are worked into 3D art objects.
6	Support	What physically holds the painting or drawing including canvas, tissue paper, watercolour paper, newsprint, cardboard and cartridge.
7	Drawing media	Technique or material that you use. Including graphite pencil, coloured pencil, ballpoint pen, ink pen, calligraphy pen, chalk, Conte crayon and pyrography.
8	Photo Editing	Alteration of an image using digital software such as Photoshop.
9	Annotation	Notes by way of explanation or

comment added to your work or the work of other artists.
