What are we trying to achieve?

In Health and Social care, students will learn how to communicate effectively with peers as part of their coursework. These skills are further developed in coursework writing, where students literacy is practiced.

Our students are encouraged to develop a detailed knowledge of the subject and should be able to link different topics together as they progress through their course. Our use of knowledge organisers creates confidence in this learning.

Students will learn about the role of health care in the local area and the way organisations can impact on peoples lives. They will take an active role in setting up a Christmas party for a local care home.

Our Health curriculum develops a range of employable skills: presentation skills, research skills, computer literacy and organisation. Students will also have opportunities to work in groups and independently.

The key concepts that run through your subject are:

Analysis: Students should be able to take their knowledge and discuss the impacts a decision would have in a health care setting.

Application to a real world example: Students should be able to link their knowledge to real world case studies developing the depth of their knowledge.
