We, as volunteers, helped the kids through the activities, where they learnt about the role of a church, the dissolution of the monasteries, rock erosion and took part in grave rubbing. We as a collective worked on

understanding the impact of Henry VIII's change in religious policy, which helped me, an A-level history student in my own understanding of the Tudor period. The trip was an enjoyment for both students and staff, with Miss Duffy enjoying shouting instructions through her new favourite toy, the megaphone, Mr Brigstock leading the grave rubbing session, and the students getting stuck right in with the series of activities in a booklet of their work over the day.

Towards the end, we all ensoyed a lunch in an open field where everyone appreciated a well-deserved break. Despite the harsh wind and rain throughout the day, everyone managed to pull through and commit fully to the educational, but fun, visit. Well done Year 7, the staff and volunteers involved!

We had to measure and record how large the pebbles were at the waterside compared to further up the beach. Next up History!
