The key concepts that run through your subject are...

Elements of music—Dynamics, Rhythm, Structure, Melody, Instrumentation, Notation, Texture, Tempo, Tonality and Harmony.

Performance—An understanding of how to express yourself through a range of performance opportunities including instruments and the voice.

Composition—The ability to express your ideas through the creation of musical ideas., including through improvisation.

Listening and Appraising—The ability to listen to and discuss music with the correct musical vocabulary, placing music in the correct historical context.

Music production—The ability to use modern musical approaches, including music software, to record and sequence music.
