

Beckfoot Sixth Form Dress Code

Beckfoot Sixth Form students do not wear a uniform, but instead have their own dress code, whereby they are treated as adults and trusted to wear clothing that is appropriate for a working environment. Sixth Form students are role models for young students and are seen by the school as working adults. The information below gives guidance on what is appropriate and what is not.

Items	Examples of permitted items	Examples of prohibited items
Trousers	Tailored trousers Chinos Smart jeans	Leggings (unless worn with skirt/dress) Joggers Tracksuit bottoms Ripped/distressed jeans Shorts
Skirts/dresses	Skirts and dresses of appropriate length i.e. no shorter than mid-thigh and a style that appropriate for school	Any item that is too short or revealing
Shirts/blouses	Smart shirts/blouses Polo shirts Tops with buttons	T-shirts Spaghetti-strap tops Items where midriff is visible Sports shirts e.g. football/rugby tops etc.
Blazer/jacket	Optional	
Jumpers/cardigans	Smart jumpers/cardigans	Hoodies Jumpers with large/offensive logos
Shoes	Sensible shoes or smart trainers which are suitable for a working environment	Open-toed sandals, flip-flops (for H&S reasons)
Other	Coats and jackets are permitted but must be removed when in the school building Student lanyards must be worn at all times	Hats Hairstyles and colour must not be extreme Jewellery should not be excessive

Please see the Head of Sixth Form if you are unsure whether a particular item of clothing is inappropriate. Students who repeatedly choose not to adhere to the Policy set out above may be sent home to change.
