

Students will sit three exams

Exam 1 (33.3% of overall grade): Philosophy of Religion

Exam 2 (33.3% of overall grade): Religion and Ethics

Exam 3 (33.3% of overall grade): Developments in Christian Thought

Students have to answer three questions (from a choice of four) on each paper. The questions are marked out of 40 and assess the pupils on the following skills:

A01 = Knowledge and Understanding (40%) A02 = Analysis and Evaluation (60%)

Students must demonstrate both skills in their written work. They must prepare to answer questions in the following areas:
